Cleantech Sector Round Table

As part of the City's economic development strategy it has become a priority to target opportunities in high growth sectors such as Cleantech.

Through the development of the Strategy it was recognized that the short-term growth of the advanced manufacturing sector is driven by the cleantech industry. In particular the renewable energy sector is taking advantage of Ontario's recently introduced Green Energy and Economy Act and the Ontario Power Authority's Feed-in-Tariff (FIT) incentive program.

Mississauga's growing Cleantech sector is one of the strongest in Southern Ontario with over 350 businesses specializing in the renewable energy sector alone. The City is a growing hub with over 4,000 employees and more than 200 companies that support the solar and wind sub-sectors.

Renewable energy companies including Italy's Silfab Ontario Inc, Austria's Fronius Canada and China's Aero-Sharp



Canada and most recently Canada's Switchable Solutions Inc. have all chosen to locate their facilities in Mississauga.

In order to gain more knowledge of this sector, The Economic Development Office (EDO) recently hosted a Cleantech sector round-table focus group to discuss ways to support a "cleantech" hub in Mississauga. The group confirmed that a diverse approach to cleantech is important rather than focusing on just solar and wind.

The EDO will use this valuable insight to develop action plans that will help shape the industry in Mississauga.

GlaxoSmithKline

GSK proudly announced the expansion of its manufacturing facility located on 7333 Mississauga Rd. The Ontario government is giving \$3.6 million to GlaxoSmithKline Inc. to help finance a \$30-million expansion. The plant already produces more than 75 different prescription products, with about 80 per cent exported to more than 100 markets worldwide. This facility expansion will create 70 new jobs.

TREC Renewable Energy/ SolarShare

TREC Renewable Energy Co-operative/ SolarShare celebrated one of the largest solar installation projects in the Greater Toronto Area. The WaterView Project features a 438 kW system covering 2.5 acres of the Daimler Buses North America Ltd. manufacturing facility's rooftop located at 350 Hazelhurst Rd.

The WaterView project is the largest of 18 solar power installations in Ontario that form the SolarShare Co-operative portfolio, totalling over 600kW of capacity and representing over \$3million of investment. The project has brought together cutting-edge technology, industry-leading design and locally-sourced human resources.

The 2011 Bio International Convention, which is the largest global event for the biotechnology industry, took place in Washington, D.C. attracting more than 15,600 industry leaders to discuss and share the latest developments, challenges and most pressing issues facing the biotech industry.
