Category: Citizenship

Recipient: Kristin Hayes

She is a Markham Accessibility Advisory Committee member and organizer of the Markham Accessibility Fair, a synchronized swimmer, a ballroom dancer, and a mentor. In her spare time, she's a speech-language pathologist.

She says being on four wheels gives her a different perspective – a different angle – that allows her to better help others. She says: "Regardless of abilities, if there's something you're interested in, you should pursue it.
