



Accessing Police & Community Resources

On the phone, in person, over the web, through television – there has never been more ways to access Police and community resources than there are today. Yet many people are unaware of the best or most convenient way to do this. This can often result in a lack of communication between the public and police or needless frustration in the event that you call. Timely communication is essential for preventing and controlling crime.

ON THE PHONE

Calls requiring assistance are available in 140 languages and through the T.D.D. (Telephone Device for the Deaf).

• Emergency Calls

Any life threatening situation, medical crisis or crime in progress is an emergency call. Dial 9-1-1. For calls involving cell phones, it is important that you know and state your location.

• Non-Emergency Calls

Any call where there is no immediate danger or no culprit present, should be directed to Communications by calling 905-453-3311. An automobile accident where no injury has occurred is an example of a non-emergency call.

• Crime Stoppers

The Crime Stoppers program offers cash rewards up to \$1,000 for information leading to an arrest. You will remain anonymous and never have to testify in court. You can contact Crime Stoppers at 1-800-222-8477.

• Community Stations

A community station is a smaller, easily accessed police facility centrally located in the community it serves. Community station officers are available to take reports of:

- Property damage
- Thefts
- Lost & Found Property
- Disorderly conduct
- Neighbour disputes
- Minor motor vehicle accidents
- Driving/traffic complaints
- Suspicious persons/activity
- Landlord Tenant Disputes
- Problems at the local schools

They can also help to solve problems of mutual concern and dispense a wide variety of information and advice. A meeting room with a 40 person capacity can be utilized by non-profit community groups and organizations.

• Divisional Police Facilities

Police Divisions are larger facilities that can be used in lieu of community

stations. Each police division has a Community Liaison Officer assigned to it. The Community Liaison Officer can assist you with your neighbourhood problems and crime prevention needs. Neighbourhood Policing Units are also assigned to Police Divisions.

• Headquarters

A variety of services are readily accessible from the headquarters lobby during specific times in the day. They include criminal background checks, firearms registration and record services.

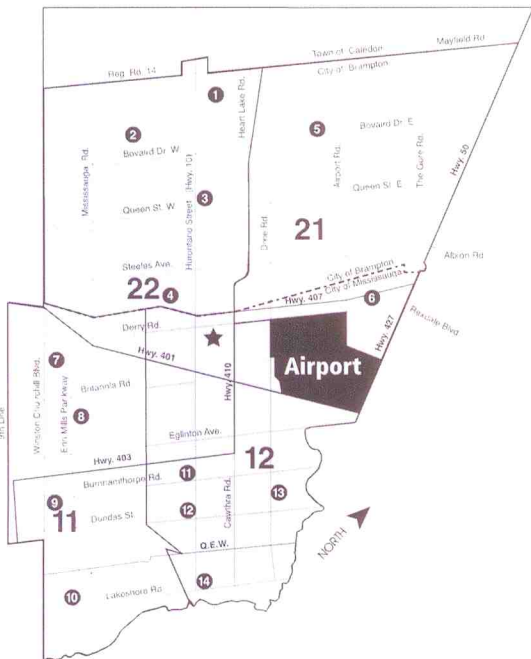
