**Collections and Storage Sub-Committee Meeting**      **November 6, 2012**

**New Donations:**

- Pace maker belonging to Joe Zammit made in Mississauga
- Transfer of items from Harris family of 6545 Creditview Road in Mississauga including original deed, electrical transfer, milk can, wringer washer, farming implements, etc. Property transfers ownership to City of Mississauga on Oct.31<sup>st</sup> and items to be delivered after transfer.

**Conservation:**

- On-going work on Mary Harris' wedding dress by Caterina Florio
- Miriam Harris to return trunk and saddle to Mississauga in November

**Exhibits: Out-Reach Displays**

- Floral Ceramics removed from Streetsville Library
- Exhibition on laundry installed at Erin Meadows Library for October and November
- Applied and accepted to install a display about Apple Farming in Mississauga at the Legislative Assembly of Ontario: Community Exhibits Program for winter 2013.
- Installed new display at Port Credit Arena. Focus is on NHL stars that played in PC arena. This display was another partnership with local collector. Removed display that was a partnership with Mississauga Sports Council and Museums.

**Exhibits: In-House Displays**

- Working with teacher Amie Tolton from Stephen Lewis Secondary School to facilitate her students creating a First Nation themed exhibit for display in the Anchorage in November.
