

**Proposed Amendments to Mississauga Official Plan and Zoning By-law 0225-2007 –
Lakeshore Road West – Clarkson Village Study**

Background:

The Clarkson Village Study was initiated in order to establish an updated, community-based vision for Clarkson Village. The study has involved an extensive public engagement process, technical review and evaluation of findings towards the preparation of recommendations for amendments to the City's Official Plan and Zoning By-law.

Proposed Amendments:

- To consider amendments to the 2011 Mississauga Official Plan (under appeal) with respect to the Clarkson Village Community Node Character Area policies; introduce new Land Use, Urban Design and Transportation, Access and Parking Policies; and to amend specific Special Site policies;
- To modify the existing "C4" (Mainstreet Commercial) zoning for the subject lands.

The proposed amendments are being considered under the Bill 51 Planning Act Requirements. (See below)

- For the City to present the proposed amendments;
- For interested individuals to ask questions and express their views about the proposed amendments; and
- For community input to be used to evaluate the proposed amendments.

Planning Act Requirements

Bill 51 Applications

1. If a person or public body does not make oral submissions at a public meeting, or make written submissions to the **City of Mississauga** before the by-law is passed, the person or public body is not entitled to appeal the decision of the City of Mississauga to the Ontario Municipal Board.
2. If a person or public body does not make oral submissions at a public meeting, or make written submissions to the **City of Mississauga** before the by-law is passed, the person or public body may not be added as a party to the hearing of an appeal before the Ontario Municipal Board unless, in the opinion of the Board, there are reasonable grounds to do so.
