

Recreational Swim and Skate Fees

City of Mississauga Council Budget Meeting Monday December 14, 2009

Background

- Older Adult plan recommended a fee assistance program for those in need with pricing to allow for sustainable and quality services
- User fees in Mississauga continue to be required against established budget and tax targets
- Recreation and Parks Division has an aggressive 53% revenue recapture ratio that includes corporate overheads and energy costs
- Future Direction surveys indicate a high user satisfaction level (including Aquatics)

Background

- Aquatic and Skating programs continue to be popular with very few concerns relating to the current fee structure
- Objectives:
 - To continue to administer fees that are affordable and encourage participation;
 - Provide pricing benefits for those that participate the most (volume discount);
 - Provide price options for participants of varying activity patterns.

Fee Report Proposal Applicable to Recreational Swimming and Skating

2009

- Per Older Adult plan,
 Fee Assistance program
 launched May 4, 2009
 (120+ seniors in program)
- Annual adult swim/skate fee of \$176.16 (pretax) applied on May 4, 2009
- From May November 2009, 700 additional annual passes were sold

2010 Recommended

- Prorating of existing annual fee to a cost of \$14.68 per month purchased (20 visits = \$0.73)
- New 100 visits for \$100 pass to those born in 1945 and before (\$1 per visit)
- New 10 tickets group/ family pass for \$63.00 (up to 5 people for swim/ skate)

Summary

Proposed structure:

- Provides a flexible monthly rate to encourage frequent participation in both swimming and skating
- The Fee Assistance Program continues to provide for residents in need (children, adults, seniors)
- Creates an Older Adult/Seniors pass older adult population that swim (1x or 2x per week) to recognize their needs (100 visits @\$1.00 per visit)
- Fees helps support continued service quality and sustainable operation of valued services
