New Hotel Development Proposed for City Centre

Mississauga's downtown landscape is about to change with news of a second hotel locating in the city centre core. The proposed mixed-use project is comprised of a 12-storey, 225-room hotel/conference centre, a large entertainment/banquet facility and eight condominium towers along with retail businesses on Duke of York Blvd. The proposed complex by The World Class Developments Ltd. (WCD), is on the 8.5-acre parcel of land immediately north of the Living Arts Centre (LAC). Currently, the artist's sketches show

the complex joined to the LAC by an overhead, covered walkway, with a street-level promenade between the two.
