DEPUTATIONS

Item 2 Douglas Markoff, Executive Director, The Riverwood Conservancy

Mr. Markoff spoke to the programs and services offered to the community throughout the year at The Riverwood Conservancy. He further spoke to the need for an enabling garden beside the McEwan Barn.

Members of Committee spoke in support of the enabling garden at The Riverwood Conservancy. Discussion ensued with respect to promotion of Riverwood's programs and services to the community. Councillor Frank Dale suggested that if there is a promotional video for Riverwood, maybe it could be played on the digital program screens at the Mississauga Celebration Square to promote Riverwood. Mr. Markoff requested that members of Committee contact their media outlets to promote Riverwood. Councillor Pat Mullin suggested that Mr. Markoff send a photograph of Riverwood with a brief summary to members of Committee with information that could be included in the Councillors' newsletters.

Mayor Hazel McCallion arrived in the Council Chamber during the deputation at 9:11 a.m.

Unfinished Business

1. <u>All-Way Stop – Miller's Grove and Switzer Gate (Ward 9)</u>

Corporate Report dated April 23, 2012 from the Commissioner of Transportation and Works with respect to an all-way stop at the intersection of Miller's Grove and Switzer Gate.

This report was presented to General Committee on May 16, 2012 and was referred to the May 30, 2012 General Committee as per GC-0370-2012.

Councillor Pat Saito noted that a survey was distributed to the residents in the area and over 75% were in support for an all-way stop. She further noted there collisions close to the intersection and a school bus stop.

RECOMMENDATION

That a by-law be enacted to amend By-law 555-2000, as amended, to implement an all-way stop at the intersection of Miller's Grove and Switzer Gate.

<u>Conservancy and Request for Approval to Extend Existing Contract with Gateman Milloy (Ward 6)</u>

Corporate Report dated May 23, 2012 from the Commissioner of Community Services with respect to the establishment of an Enabling Garden through donation from The Riverwood Conservancy and a request for approval to extend the existing contract with Gateman Milloy.

6. Removal of 15-hour Parking Anytime and Implementation of No Parking Anytime – Tenth Line West between Thomas Street and Bentley Drive (Ward 10)

Corporate Report dated May 8, 2012 from the Commissioner of Transportation and Works with respect to the removal of 15 hour parking anytime and implementation of No Parking Anytime on Tenth Line West between Thomas Street and Bentley Drive.

Councillor Sue McFadden explained that the 15 hour parking on Tenth Line West was creating an issue with sightlines on the street.

RECOMMENDATION

That a by-law be enacted to amend By-law 555-2000, as amended, to remove 15-hour parking anytime and implement no parking anytime on the east side of Tenth Line West between Thomas Street and Bentley Drive.

7. Removal of 15-hour Parking Anytime – Tenth Line West at McDowell Drive (Ward 10)

Corporate Report dated May 8, 2012 from the Commissioner of Transportation and Works with respect to the removal of 15 hour parking anytime at Tenth Line West at McDowell Drive.

Councillor Sue McFadden explained that the parked cars are creating a problem for the school buses as they can't pull into the driveway and that leads to traffic congestion.

RECOMMENDATION

That a by-law be enacted to amend By-law 555-2000, as amended, to remove 15-hour parking anytime on the west side of Tenth Line West between McDowell Drive and Ridgeleigh Heights.

8. <u>15-hour Parking – Sanderling Crescent (Ward 8)</u>

That a by-law be enacted to amend By-law 555-2000, as amended, to implement 15-hour parking anytime on both sides of Sanderling Crescent between the south intersection of South Millway and Swallowdale Court.

- 2. That authority be granted to allow children (Grades 1-8) to ride free when accompanied by a fare paying passenger and that valid MiWay pass holders (weekly, monthly, annual, U-Pass) be allowed to bring a companion on board for free all day on Canada Day, Sunday July 1, 2012.

RECOMMENDATION

- 1. That the gross and net budget of the project to redevelop the City property at 10 Dundas Street East (southeast corner of Dundas Street East and Hurontario Street) under PN 09- 301 be increased by \$300,000 from \$289,200 to \$589,200, by transferring funding of \$288,792 from allocated Ward 7 funding in 2009 Special Project Capital Reserve Fund (Account #35574), and funding of \$11,208 from Ward 7 Reserve Fund Mascan Amenities Dundas Fairview (Account #35340).
- 2. That the City property at 10 Dundas Street East (southeast corner of Dundas Street East and Hurontario Street) be named Cooksville Four Corners and that Council waive the requirement for a 30 day consideration period as outlined in the City's "Property and Facility Naming and Dedications" corporate policy.
- 3. That all necessary by-laws be enacted.

Paul Damaso, Manager, Mississauga Celebration Square advised that staff have not received any complaints since the sound was adjusted and that advertising is not permitted on the digital program screens.

RECOMMENDATION

That the proposed Corporate Policy and Procedure entitled Digital Program Screens in Mississauga Celebration Square attached as Appendix 1 to the Corporate Report dated May 15, 2012 from the Commissioner of Community Services be approved.

That a by-law be enacted authorizing the Commissioner of Community Services and the City Clerk to execute and affix the corporate seal to a Lease Amending Agreement, and all documents ancillary thereto, between The Corporation of the City of Mississauga as Sublandlord and The Regional Municipality of Peel as Subtenant, for a community police station, containing an area of approximately 144 square metres (1,545 square feet), located within the Meadowvale Branch Library at 6677 Meadowvale Town Centre Circle, east of Winston Churchill Boulevard and north of Battleford Road, and is located on lands legally described as Parcel 1-2, Section M-182, being part of Lot 1, Plan M-182, City of Mississauga, Regional Municipality of Peel, designated as Parts 1, 2, 3, 4, 5 and 6 on Reference Plan 43R-6079, Save and Except that Part of Lot 1 on Plan M-182 designated as Parts 7 and 10 on Reference Plan 43R-21640, in the City of Mississauga, in the Regional Municipality of Peel, in Ward 9, for the term commencing on March 31, 2012 and terminating on March 30, 2015.
