in Canada in 1942 featuring Alan Skeoch**

Two months after Japanese fighter bombers devastated Pearl Harbour (Dec. 7, 1941), all Canadian Japanese citizens were interned under the War Measures Act (Feb. 24, 1942). A wave of prejudice that already existed became a 'tsunami' that swept all Japanese into internment camps in the Canadian interior.

Last spring Alan and his wife visited the Cherry Blossom Orchard in High Park. All these beautiful trees were donated a decade after World War II to the citizens of Toronto by the citizens of Tokyo in ap-

preciation. Why? The horrors of the atomic bombs must have been fresh in Japanese memory as was the ill treatment of the Canadian Hong Kong POWs, as were the very fresh memories of the Japanese internment. The trouble with historical research is the answers are never simple.
