Dear Mayor McCallion:

Thank you for your letter regarding the heads and beds rate for payments in Ileu (PIL) of taxes on hospitals, universities, and colleges.

The total provincial payment to municipalities under this program is approximately \$43.5 million annually. This amount is retained by municipalities and not shared with school boards. It is important to note that municipalities also receive a significant economic benefit from these provincially-supported institutions including the impact of staff expenditures, and the use of facilities for community purposes.

I am certain you will agree that our government has a very strong record of supporting and working with municipalities. Despite the province's fiscal challenges, we remain committed to our decision to upload social assistance benefit program costs from the property tax base. We understand the importance of this commitment to our municipal partners.

As you may know, the current PIL program was discussed as a part of the Provincial-Municipal Fiscal and Service Delivery Review (PMFSDR). However, municipal representatives and the Association of Municipalities of Ontario (AMO) identified the upload of social assistance benefit program costs from the property tax base as their top priority. Once fully implemented, these uploads, along with the upload of up to \$125 million annually in court security costs, will result in a net benefit to municipalities of \$1.5 billion annually. The removal of these costs from the property tax base will benefit all taxpayers, including those residing in the City of Mississauga.

It is important to note that by 2018, we will have increased ongoing annual support to municipalities to \$4 billion, an increase of more than 270 per cent compared to 2003.

While I appreciate the time you have taken to keep me informed about this matter as it concerns the City of Mississauga, given the province's fiscal situation, the government is not contemplating a further review of our policies in this area at this time. Please be assured, however, that your comments will be taken under advisement during any future deliberations.
