# 2. <u>Draft Idling Control By-law</u>

Memorandum dated May 8, 2009 from Andrea McLeod, Environmental Coordinator, Environmental Management, Community Services with respect to the draft Idling Control By-law.

Ms. McLeod explained that staff were directed by the Mississauga Environmental Advisory Committee to develop a by-law for the regulation of vehicle idling toward air emission reduction in the City of Mississauga. The proposed Idling Control by-law represents the City's commitment toward reducing vehicle emissions that contribute to climate change and poor air quality. The City will be re-launching its anti-idling education campaign after the by-law is enacted. Ms. McLeod indicated that City staff would like to work with this Committee to relay the message to the taxicab industry.

Ms. McLeod and Edward Nicolucci, Manager, Environmental Management, Community Services, responded to questions from Committee with respect to the content of the proposed by-law. Committee expressed concern that taxicabs and limos were not exempt from the by-law and Mr. Nicolucci advised that the proposed by-law contains a clause which confirms that the *Highway Traffic Act* would supersede the Idling Control By-law. This clause in the by-law satisfied Committee's concerns.

It was noted that a staff report recommending this proposed by-law would be presented to General Committee at its meeting on June 10, 2009. Committee requested that staff report back to this Committee after the by-law has been enacted in order to promote and relay information about the by-law to the industry.

# 3. <u>Bi-Annual Taxicab Tariff Review</u>

Corporate Report dated May 28, 2009 from the Commissioner of Transportation and Works Department with respect to the bi-annual taxicab tariff review.

Committee was reminded that it previously discussed implementing regular methodology reviews of the licence issuance on even number years. Staff concurred that 2010 would be an appropriate year to implement such review.

### 4. Transfer of Taxicab Owner Licences

Corporate Report dated May 28, 2009 from the Commissioner of Transportation and Works Department providing proposed amendments to the Public Vehicle Licensing By-law 420-04 with respect to the transfer of taxicab owner licences from the estate of a taxicab owner.

#### Recommendation:

- 1. That Schedule 8 Section 51 of By-law 0420-2004, be amended to require that a Certificate of Appointment of Estate Trustee With a Will and the Certificate of Appointment of Estate Trustee Without a Will be provided prior to approving the transfer of a taxicab owner licence by an estate trustee.
- 2. That Schedule 8 Section 51 of By-law 0420-2004, be amended to allow the shares of a corporation which owns a taxicab licence to be transferred to the spouse of a deceased owner without the spouse requiring a taxicab driver's licence.
- 3. That Schedule 8 Section 51 of By-law 0420-2004, be amended to indicate that a taxicab owner licence shall automatically become an asset of the deceased owner's estate upon his/her death and that the licence shall only be suspended when the owner's name appears on the vehicle ownership.
- 4. That the necessary by-law be enacted to the satisfaction of Legal Services.

### OTHER BUSINESS

### A. Accessible Public Vehicles

Email dated February 18, 2009 from Mark Sexsmith and email dated March 31, 2009 from Ron Baumber of Golden Taxi (2008), distributed at the meeting.

Staff explained that currently non-transferable accessible licenses are issued by the Manager of Mobile Licensing Enforcement in accordance with the City by-law and explained the process for obtaining one. The taxicab industry will be subject to the proposed Accessible Transportation Standard under the Accessibility for Ontarians with Disabilities Act, 2005 (AODA) when it becomes law which may require issuance of more accessible taxicabs. Staff commented that the current method is being monitored and is not being abused. Al Cormier, Chair of Accessible Transportation Standard Development Committee provided some insight on how the standard might impact the taxicab industry and that it may be up to the Municipality to set standards on accessible fleets. Committee directed staff to report back on the matter at a time that is timely with the AODA Accessible Transportation Standard becoming law.
