

NOTICE OF INTENTION TO DESIGNATE IN THE MATTER OF THE ONTARIO HERITAGE ACT, R.S.O. 1990, CHAPTER 0.18, AS AMENDED, AND IN THE MATTER OF THE LANDS AND PREMISES KNOWN AS THE PORT CREDIT MEMORIAL ARENA LOCATED AT 40 STAVEBANK ROAD IN THE CITY OF MISSISSAUGA, IN THE PROVINCE OF ONTARIO. TAKE NOTICE that the Council of The Corporation of the City of Mississauga intends to designate these lands and premises under Part IV of The Ontario Heritage Act, R.S.O. 1990, c. 0.18, as amended.

Statement of Cultural Heritage Value or Interest

The Port Credit Memorial Arena has physical/design value as; the first public and oldest surviving arena in the area now known as Mississauga, an early example of a barrel vaulted arena in Mississauga, and a rare example of public 1950s Contempo architecture in Mississauga.

The Port Credit Memorial Arena has historical/associative value because; it has direct associations with both the Town and community of Port Credit, as well as the veterans that it memorializes, and that it demonstrates the work of Robert Fairfield, Routhwaite and Fairfield, a significant Canadian architect.

The Port Credit Memorial Arena has contextual value because it supports the recreational and/or commemorative character of Port Credit Memorial Park and the nearby Cenotaph, is physically, visually and historically linked to its surroundings, and is a landmark.
