

Fire Station 106 Update

As you may be aware Fire Station 106 is currently located on Dixie Rd just north of Bloor St. A feasibility study was completed in August of 2007 to identify renovation and rebuild options and at that time it was determined that the station was deficient in many areas and the building does not meet current City of Mississauga standards. Also, as part of the Region of Peel's ongoing efforts to enhance their paramedic services to the same community, Peel Regional Paramedic Services expressed an interest in locating a satellite station at this site. After review, it was determined that the current site was not adequate for a combined facility that would provide accommodations for two fire crews and two paramedic ambulances. As it is imperative that the Fire Station continue to be located in the same response area, an alternate site at 1385 Winding Trail was identified as the new location for this station.

This site is a 1.7 acre site just north of the existing station and is well located to continue to meet response requirements. It is also ideally located to allow both Fire and EMS vehicles easier access to Dixie Rd as there are existing street lights at the intersection of Winding Trail and Dixie Rd.

If you have had the opportunity to pass by the site recently, you will see that the building is currently under construction. At the outset, our goal was to find a suitable balance between a sustainable approach to the environment and the enhancing community safety. We believe we have achieved that goal. The facility will include the following "green" initiatives:

- Re-landscaped Park
- Addition of 60 new trees
- Defined walkway through the park from Dixie Rd
- Butterfly Garden plantings
- Protection of the adjacent natural woodlot
- "Green Roof" design over the building administration areas
- Permeable Pavers for driveways and parking areas to allow natural drainage of surface
- Flat roof design to accommodate future solar cell technology

Construction is expected to be completed by May 2012 with an official opening to follow.

The Bus Rapid Transit (BRT) project will be a high-efficiency transit corridor running east-west across Mississauga. The BRT will support allstation stop and extensive express bus service for thousands of riders per day, making it faster and easier for you to travel to, from and through Mississauga and the GTA. Construction on the project is currently underway.

Once completed in 2013, the BRT will have 11 new stations at major road crossings and connect with the City Centre Transit Terminal at Square One. It will also connect with interregional transit and the TTC subway.


Going Green...lt's a SNAP!



I was thrilled to launch a campaign to honour one of Canada's greatest heroes, Paul Henderson. Paul Henderson, a former Ward 3 resident, became a Canadian sports legend on September 28, 1972. His goal, with 34 seconds remaining in the final game, lifted Canada to victory in the "Series

Mississauga's Youth Plan

The City of Mississauga's Youth Plan was approved in 2009. Community Centres, libraries and community partners have been busy implementing the recommendations from a plan into a Youth Movement.

In 2011 Burnhamthorpe Community Centre and Burnhamthorpe Library worked with their youth advisory teams and community partners to deliver a number of exciting youth programs designed to keep young people busy after school, entertained on weekends, informed about important topics and provided many opportunities for young people to volunteer and become involved in their neighbourhood. Here are some highlights from last year 2011

Burnhamthorpe Community Centre had over 6,957 participants and 135 volunteers who put in 1023 hours towards Youth Movement programs and events. Popular programs included MyNBA drop in basketball, Chill Zone lobby drop in program, Dances, Raptors Community Liaison skills program, Co-op student placements from Humber College. Special mention to the Toronto Raptors Community Liaison event in December where 70 young people learned from Coach Davis life skills related to respect and leadership.

Burnhamthorpe Library was closed for renovations earlier in 2011 and as soon as it re-opened youth programs and events went into full swing with 295 participants and 608 volunteers who put in 1363 hours. Special mention to a new program called Computer Buddies **mississauga.ca/portal/residents/library** where 20 senior citizens were paired with 20 young people who taught the seniors basic computer skills.

Teens join TAG for many reasons: to meet other teens, to share a love of books, to gain experience to list on university and scholarship applications, to receive credit for volunteering, and – above all – to have a direct voice in shaping the type of library they envision for themselves and their peers.



The Mississauga Furniture Bank

The Mississauga Furniture Bank (MFB) collects gently used basic household items and furniture from individuals and corporations and redistributes those items to families in need as determined by local social agencies. By acting as a hub between donors and social agencies, the MFB not only helps those in need but also has a positive ecological impact as furniture and other household items are diverted from local landfills.

Applewood Hills Pathway

The Applewood Hills pathway (North of Rathburn Road to Eastgate Parkway) is scheduled for reconstruction. The Community Services Department realized cost saving efficiencies initiated through the Parks & Forestry Leadership Team and the implementation of the Pathway Paving Program. These efficiencies allowed the funding for one high priority unfunded park pathway from the previously unfunded list. It is intended to have construction work implemented immediately with the removal and disposal of the existing pathway and installation of a granular pathway which will receive asphalt paving surface in Spring of 2012.
