Throughout the province, there is a growing pride in our heritage. Communities boast of their commercial buildings, courthouses, places of worship, gardens, natural heritage and other architecturally significant sites. From April to October each year, communities across Ontario open the doors to some of our most intriguing and charming sites.

Mississauga: "The Cinderella Township" to "Canada's Sixth Largest City"

This year, Doors Open Mississauga revisits the 1957 promotional film, "The Cinderella Township" as a point of departure for its annual city showcase event. This short film was created by the Township of Toronto (now City of Mississauga) to attract new industries and residents to the area. Today, the film stands as both an idyllic and starkly telling document of the great period of infrastructure and industrial development that Mississauga has undergone over the past fifty years. The film will be screening throughout the month of September on Mississauga Celebration Square. An accompanying exhibition of film stills and contemporary photographs by Marco Veltri are also on view from September to December at the Mississauga Central Library.

This project is co-presented by the City of Mississauga's Culture Division, Mississauga Library System and Heritage Mississauga and is supported by Friends of the Library and Metalworks.
