

Awards and Judging Criteria AWARDS

There are two potential awards:

Award of Excellence

This Award exemplifies, as much as possible, the judging criteria and, in particular, the City's design principles.

Award of Merit

This award demonstrates excellence in one or more of the judging criteria and the City's design principles.

Judging Criteria

Projects have been assessed according to the following criteria:

Significance: City Wide Scale

Contribution to the City design objectives as related to City image, visual identity, vistas, skyline, streetscapes, recognition of sites and location opportunities.

Significance: Community Scale

Contribution to the quality of the environment within a community which demonstrates a regard for the context of the locale, enhancing a sense of place and personal safety or reinforcing a unique history.

Innovation

The degree of creative response to program requirements, site constraints and the ability to influence trends.

Context

The relationship or blending of built forms and spaces with existing and planned development, and respect for and enhancement of the area's character.

Execution


The quality of construction materials, and the interpretation of the design into reality.

AstraZeneca is an innovative, well-executed project that exceeds typical development standards. The combination of light coloured materials with large glass surfaces makes the building welcoming to the user. Considering the context of the site, the project is a hidden gem and serves as an excellent example for reinvestment in the area. Instead of a typical office building, the designers took this project a step further to create an enjoyable place for people to work that exhibits a smooth transition from the exterior to interior space. The high quality landscaping complements the architecture of this project to create a humane environment. AstraZeneca raises the bar of design excellence for new developments not only within its immediate area but also for the city as a whole.



Award of Excellence

Port Credit Village Townhomes
St. Lawrence Drive and Hurontario Street

Port Credit Village is a unique project where both the local community and the city championed the virtue of community-based urban design. Through approprate landscape design, architectural character, massing and scale, an impressive pedestrian-oriented development has been achieved that will undoubtedly serve as a showcase for the City. The project functions as an attractive gateway for the City to the lake and re-establishes a public connection for the community to the lakefront that had not existed for decades. Port Credit Village demonstrates the right mix of urban edge dynamics with it's street system, open space areas, vistas towards the lake, scale, variety of uses and walkability. The attractive pedestrian environment that results will only help to support retail uses in the Port Credit area. This project sets a precedent for future waterfront developments, not only for the City of Mississauga, but also for the rest of the Province.



Award Of Excellence

The Pines 1706 - 1742 The Pines

The Pines is a sensitively designed, highly contextual in-fill project. The challenge with this project was to integrate with and reinforce the existing community character. The preservation of existing vegetation, in combination with the architectural character of the buildings, results in a project that works well with the existing neighbouring community. The central open space, complemened by an attractive streetscape design, creates a unique sense of place and character for the development. Meticulous execution of the design that was respectful to the neighbouring context, both natural and man-made, is innovative and is a refreshing departure from the typical development scenario. The Pines provides an excellent example of how to integrate a development with increased density into an existing community, while still preserving the existing character and scale of a neighbourhood. It provides a model to take inspiration from for future in-fill projects.



Award Of Merit for Architecture:

6120 Mavis Road

Mercedes-Benz Canada, Inc. R.H. Carter Architects, Inc.

The Mercedes Benz dealership is a bold, highly visual and unique landmark building. The building has been strategically placed at the front of the site to create a strong street presence that reinforces the intersection. Storage areas have been placed behind the building, thereby creating a more approachable and attractive building face from the public street. This structure is a powerful piece of architecture that reflects the machine image of the product it houses.



Award of Merit for Innovation:

Biovail Corporate Headquarters 7150 Mississauga Road

Biovail Corporation Adamson Associates Architects EDA Collaborative

The Biovail project has made good use of a constrained site. The bold architectural statement of this project, in combination with the use of water and high quality building materials creates a strong visual impact upon the street and reinforces the corner, while at the same time respecting the site topography. This project offers something beyond just a building for the people who work there, it has established itself more as a public art form. As such, it sets a precedent for development that has an impact on a city wide scale.






