

MISSISSAUGA CELEBRATION SQUARE RESTRICTIONS DEMONSTRATIONS, RALLIES AND VIGILS

The City of Mississauga does not issue permits for demonstrations, rallies and vigils.

If you do not have a permit, the following activities are prohibited at Celebration Square:

- Use of the stage
- Use of generators
- Use of electrical outlets
- Distribution of food or beverage
- Use of flames or candles

If you do not have a permit, the following activities may be subject to fines pursuant to Parks By-Law 186-05:

- Interfering with a picnic, organized gathering or event authorized by permit
- Selling, offering to sell, or displaying for sale
- Soliciting for business or charity
- Distribution of circulars, advertisements, or promotional items
- Driving a vehicle in a park other than on a roadway or parking area
- Use of any sound amplifying equipment
- Engaging in riotous, boisterous, violent, threatening, or illegal activity, or use profane or abusive language;
- Engaging in any activity that creates a nuisance or that interferes with the use and enjoyment of the park by other persons;
- Engaging in any activity that may cause injury or damage to any person, animal, tree or property;
- Erecting, placing or installing any permanent or temporary structure, tent or booth;
- Closing a road (Special Events Temporary Road Closure By-Law 51-06)
- Littering on City property (Debris and Anti-Littering By-law 219-85)
