A series of community rides will be taking place across the city until October. They vary in distances and all riders are welcome; it's a great way to meet new people and enjoy the City's trails and the outdoors.

Golf is another great outdoor sport that provides exercise, mobility and activity. Both City courses — BraeBen and Lakeview — are great places to take lessons, practice your putting, visit the driving range or hit the greens and are suitable for all skill levels.

Keep Pets Safe this Summer!

Remember that hot weather can be hard on our furry friends.

Avoid strenuous outdoor activities, provide shade and cool water and avoid hot pavement or surfaces that may burn sensitive paws.

Pets with light skin or short hair can suffer sunburn and pug nosed breeds can be more susceptible to breathing difficulties.



Finally, never leave your pet in a parked car, even with the windows open, as temperatures can rise very quickly putting your pet in serious danger of heat stroke or death.

Making Housing More Affordable

Mississauga is facing a housing affordability crisis. Home prices are out of reach for 80% of Mississauga households.

The City is taking action to make housing more affordable. Some ways we are doing this include:

- Negotiating with developers to secure affordable units in new developments
- Providing incentives to promote new affordable rental construction
- Looking at ways to increase housing options such as duplexes, triplexes and garden suites in existing neighbourhoods
- Protecting the supply of rental housing



The housing crisis is complex and we can't tackle it alone. The City has provided recommendations to the federal and provincial governments to help build more housing and make it more affordable.
