On the path to Independence

With the passing of Bill 112 or the Hazel McCallion Act, the process has begun to dissolve the Regional Municipality of Peel and grant independent status to Mississauga.

A provincially appointed, five-member transition board will work in collaboration with the City of Mississauga, the City of Brampton, Peel Region and the Town of Caledon on the equitable distribution of assets and resources and to ensure all essential services continue to be delivered without disruption.

Apply to the Driveway Windrow Snow Clearing Program

The City offers a driveway windrow clearing program for residents 65 years and older, and for persons with physical disabilities.

Participants in the program will have a three-metre space cleared in the windrow at the bottom of their driveway after snow plowing has ended. The program runs from December 1, 2023 until March 11, 2024 and is available to 750 participants on a first-come, first-served basis.



New Malton Youth Hub Opening Fall 2023

The Malton Youth Hub, Jonathan Davis Centre, is set to open at the end of 2023 and will provide services and programs that reflect the needs of local youth in Malton for free.

The 18,000 square foot Youth Hub will offer youth a safe, attractive space to hang out, do homework, listen to music, dance, learn to cook healthy meals and organize their own special events.



It will even have a professionally designed and equipped recording studio for budding artists. The Youth Hub will be complemented with dedicated space for Anchor Partners to offer integrated programs and services that are catered toward youth.
