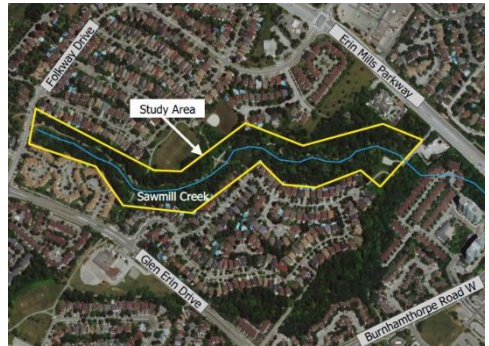


CITY OF MISSISSAUGA - NOTICE OF COMPLETION

Municipal Class Environmental Assessment (EA) Study
Sawmill Creek Erosion Control Project
Folkway Drive to Erin Mills Parkway

PROJECT BACKGROUND

The City of Mississauga has completed a Schedule 'B' Class EA Study for erosion control and restoration of Sawmill Creek from Folkway Drive to Erin Mills Parkway. The Study was undertaken to address erosion and risk to infrastructure along the creek. The Study team has carried out various analyses to:



- Characterize existing conditions
- Complete assessments of the physical site and ecology, hydrology, hydraulics and channel geomorphology, and social and archaeological elements
- Develop alternatives to mitigate erosion impacts and provide enhancements
- Evaluate alternatives & select a preferred solution considering public feedback

STUDY COMPLETION

Based on the Study findings and feedback received, a reach-based solution that applies both spot repairs and channel improvements was selected as the preferred alternative to provide long-term erosion control while managing the extent of environmental impacts.

A Project File Report has been completed to document the planning and decision-making process for this study. Due to the current pandemic, the Project File is available for review over an extended timeframe of 45 days. Engagement for essential and priority projects continues online, paired with universally accessible methods.

Interested members of the public may view the Project File on the City's website. Should a member of the public request a hard copy of the Project File, the City will assess how this might be prepared and delivered in a manner that is consistent with regional and provincial guidelines supporting physical distancing.

By this Notice, the Project File is being placed on public record for review from September 16, 2021 to November 1, 2021 and is available online on the City's website at mississauga.ca/sawmillcreek
