NOTICE OF STUDY COMPLETION

What is this study all about?

The City of Mississauga is completing its first ever Pedestrian Master Plan. The plan will shape how pedestrian connections are designed and implemented across our neighbourhoods, helping to enhance and create safe places for people to walk in Mississauga. The plan will act as a go-to reference for pedestrian infrastructure projects until 2041, supporting the City's commitment to a Vision Zero approach.

How was this study undertaken?

This study was undertaken in accordance with Approach 1 of the Master Planning process as set out in the Municipal Class Environmental Assessment (EA) (October 2000, as amended in 2007, 2011 and 2015), which is an approved process under the Ontario Environmental Assessment Act. This approach involves the preparation of a master plan document at the conclusion of Phases 1 and 2 of the Class EA process.

In light of the restrictions on public gatherings, the Pedestrian Master Plan documents are available for public review on the Project Website at yoursay.mississauga.ca/pedestrian-master-plan for a period of 45 days, as of August 16, 2021.
