



Pedestrian Master Plan

The City of Mississauga is developing its first ever Pedestrian Master Plan.

The plan will shape how pedestrian connections are designed and implemented across our neighbourhoods, helping to enhance and create safe places for people to walk in Mississauga. The plan will act as a go-to reference for pedestrian infrastructure projects until 2041, supporting the City's commitment to a Vision Zero approach.

The Pedestrian Master Plan will help City staff identify priority projects and improvements to the pedestrian network to 2041, and will build on the Transportation Master Plan goals related to developing a more walkable, livable, and healthier city where our streets are safe for all users.
