Re: School Streets Pilot Project




Dear Resident,

The City of Mississauga is leading an innovative pilot project in your neighbourhood called **School Streets**. A School Street creates a **temporary, car-free environment** in front of a school during drop-off and/or pick-up times. This creates safe, community-friendly spaces for students and their parents or guardians walking and cycling to and from school. It also limits non-local traffic using the residential street.

About the project

Pending COVID-19-related school closures, the pilot project will launch this **May and will run for 3 weeks for 70 minutes at the end of each school day** (i.e. from 2:30pm to 3:40pm).

The planned area for the temporary road closure on Havenwood Drive is shown below:



■■■■■■■■ Road Closure Area (No Through Traffic)

The road closure area on Havenwood Drive will be closed to all vehicle traffic, with exceptions for school buses, emergency vehicles and residents who live on Havenwood Drive within the closure area. Residents living within the closure will be allowed access by vehicle between their driveways and the boundaries of the closure area, if needed. They will be expected to travel at a very slow speed and be aware of children and other pedestrians who may be on the road.

Our goal is for this project to be a partnership between the City of Mississauga and your local community. We are working to build a local Project Planning Team, including representatives from the participating schools (i.e. St Alfred Separate School and Brian W. Fleming Public School), local residents and other community partners. The Project Planning team will meet three times (virtually) between February and the launch of the pilot in May.
