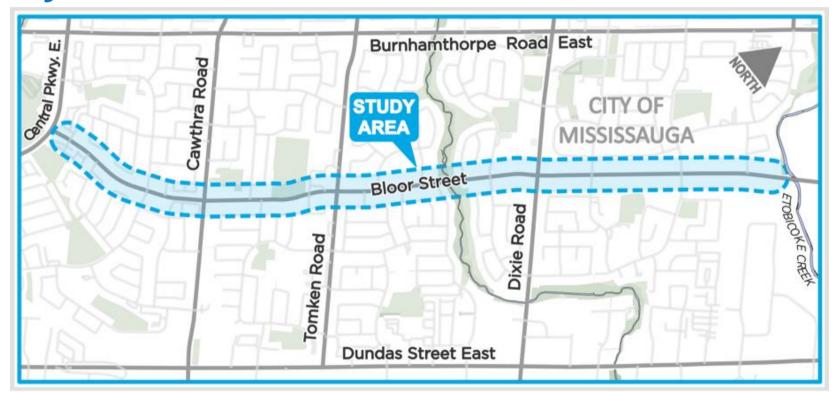

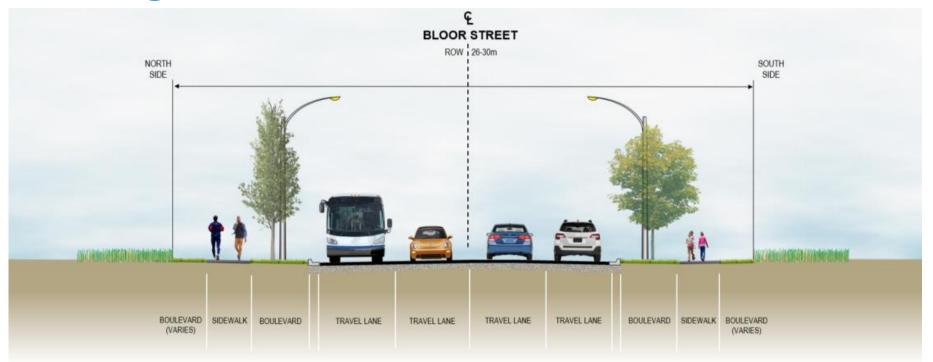

Road Safety – Vision Zero



Adopted by Mississauga in 2018



Goal of Vision Zero:

Eliminate all serious injuries and fatal collisions



City Council approved 99 Actions to advance road safety

Vision Zero Action Plan (2021)

Actions grouped by the 5 E's of road safety:





Evaluation – Tracking and monitoring incidents to improve future conditions.



Engineering – Prioritizing the safety of vulnerable users through road design.



Enforcement – Ensuring there are consequences for breaking rules of the road.



Education – Fostering concern for community members who are at risk or have been harmed while travelling.



Empathy – Learning and to follow best practices, including outreach and education.

- Road Diet(On-RoadBike Lanes)
- 2 lanes
- Sidewalks (both sides)
- Separated Bike Lanes (both sides)

Alternative 3 (In-Boulevard Cycle Track North Side)

- 4 lanes
- Sidewalks (both sides)
- Cycle Track, two-way (north side)

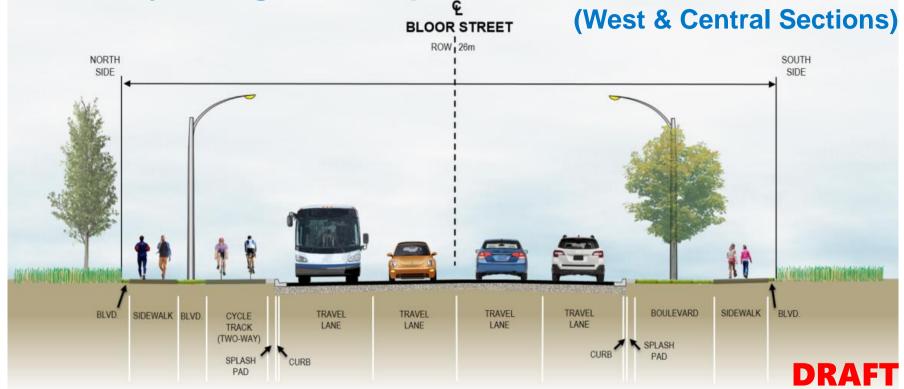

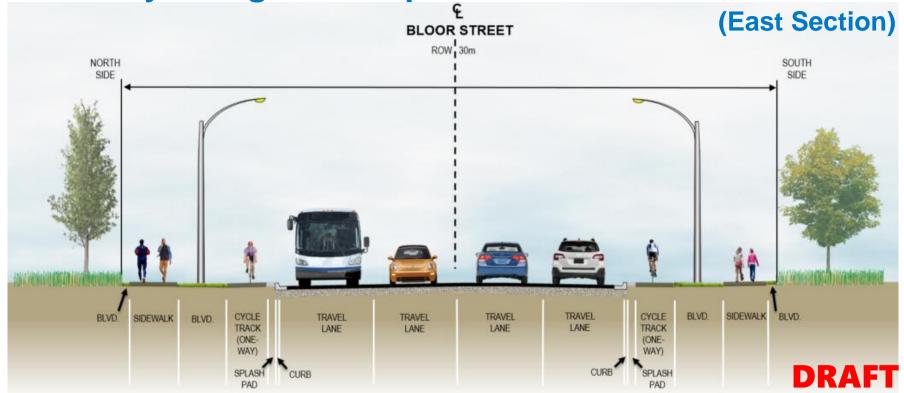

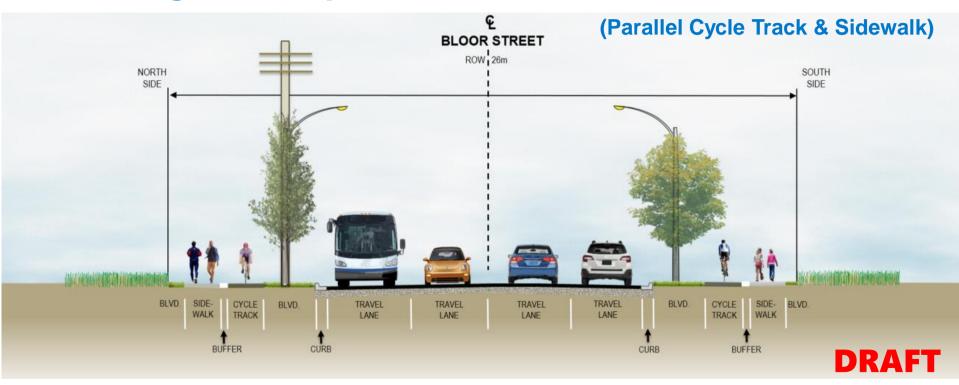

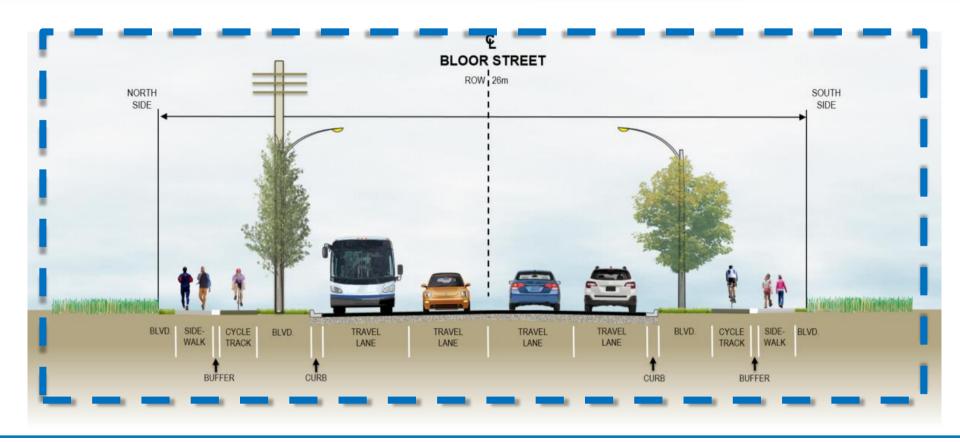

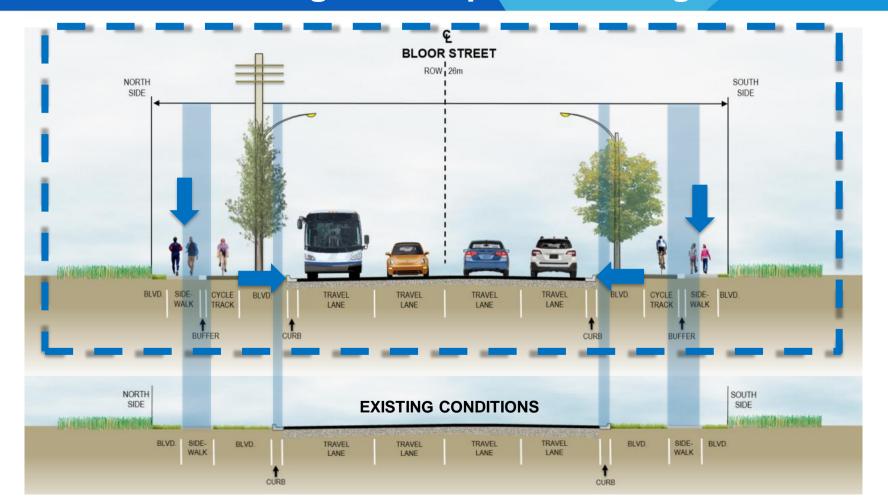

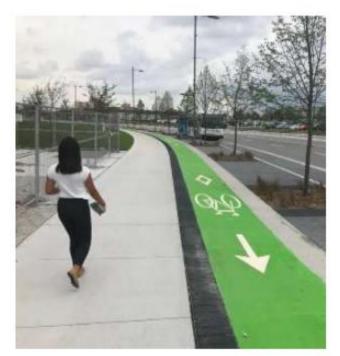

Continuous Detectable Tactile Buffer Strip

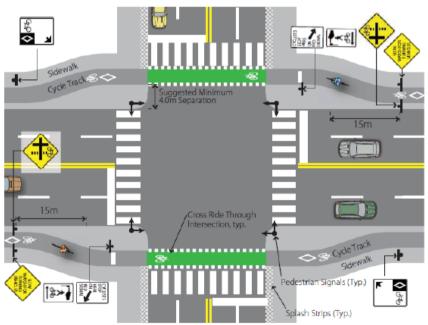

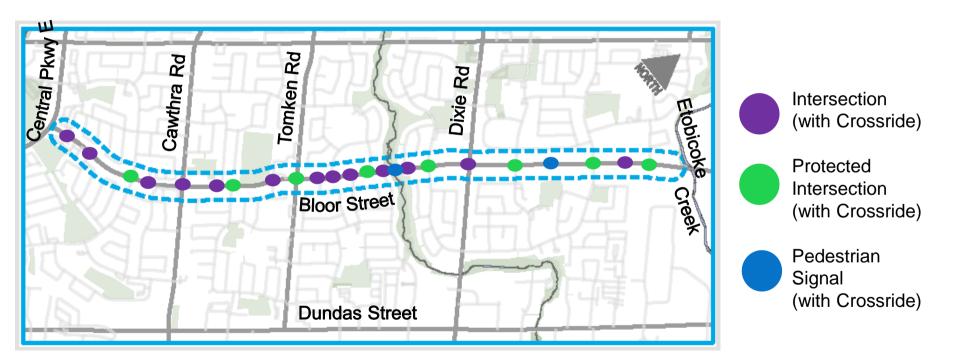

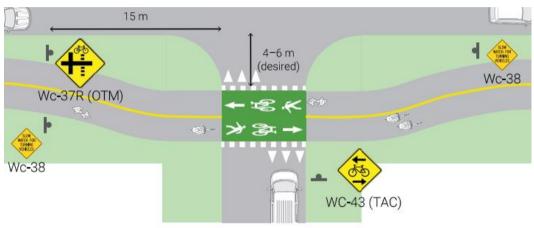

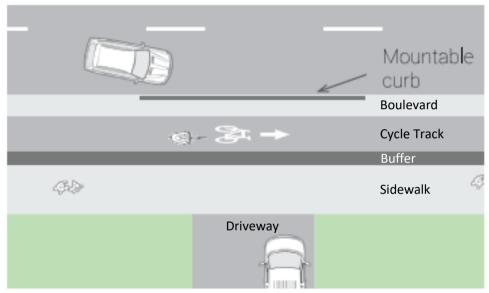

Noise Assessment



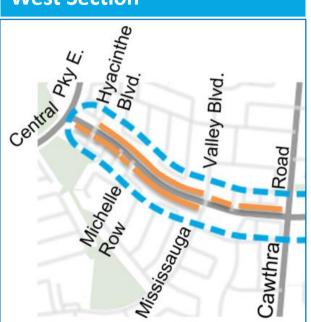
- A Noise Assessment has been completed for the Bloor Street corridor
- Assessed both existing and future (2041) noise levels
- Noise modelling included the Outdoor Living Area (OLA) for residential noise sensitive locations
- Noise Assessment has determined that noise mitigation is warranted

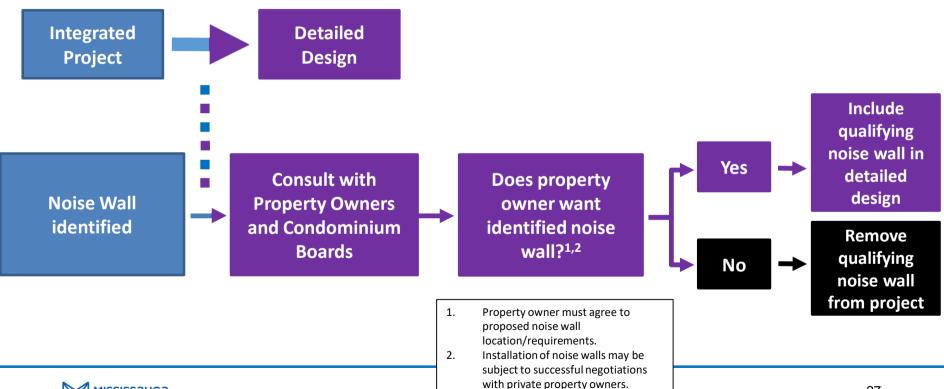

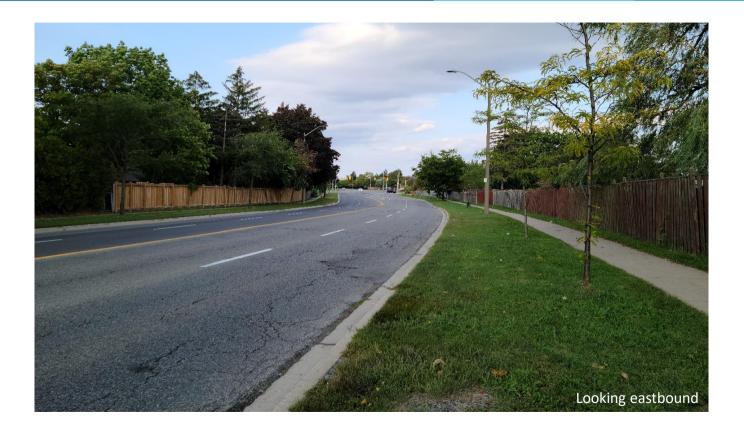

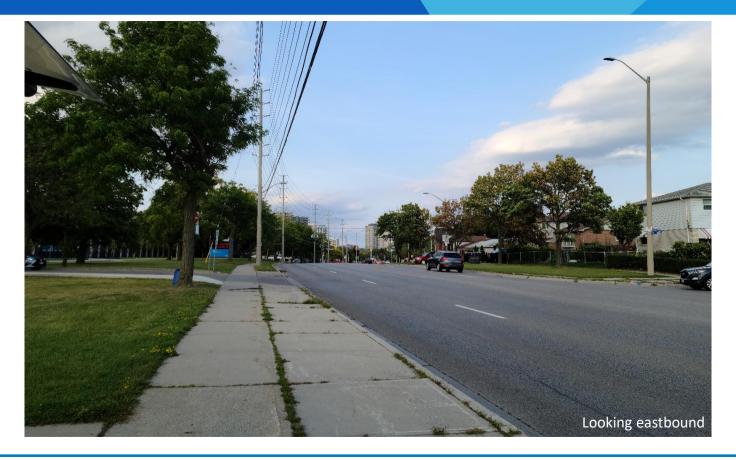

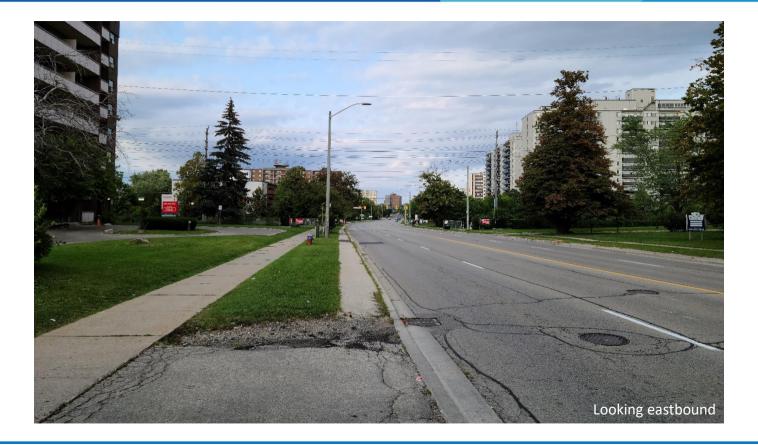
