Anise Hyssop (<i>Agastache foeniculum</i>)	Zig-zag Goldenrod (<i>Solidago flexicaulis</i>)
Prairie Dropseed (<i>Sporobolus heterolepis</i>)	Little Bluestem (<i>Schizachyrium scoparium</i>) - M/H
Bottlebrush Grass (<i>Elymus hystrix</i>)	Spotted Mint (<i>Monarda punctata</i>) - M

Additional Notes:

- Native plant species selection based on:
 - drought/**salt tolerance**
 - under 1 meter in height; no thorns or sharp leaves
 - o plants with an asterisk (*) need to be pruned in June to keep height under 1 meter
 - native species indigenous to our local area; pollen and nectar-rich to benefit pollinators
 - adapted to thrive in site's soil (clay/loam/sand) and pH (acidic, alkaline)
- The salt tolerant annotations:
 - H** = high salt tolerance
 - M** = medium salt tolerance
 - L** = low salt tolerance
 - T** = degree of tolerance unknown
- It is important to select plants best adapted to available light and soil conditions.
