Land Acknowledgment



School Streets

THIS ROAD WILL BE CLOSED TO CARS





May 9 – May 27

8:15 am – 8:50 am 2:30 pm – 3:20pm Monday – Friday

- Create temporary car-free environments in front of schools at start and/or end of school day
 - Exemptions: Emergency vehicles, special education school buses, immediate residents, those who need additional mobility support
- Make space and prioritize safe conditions for walking and other active travel
- Help us to rethink the journey to school



Why School Streets?

School Streets Pilot Project



- Encouraging active travel to school
- Improving road safety
- Reducing traffic congestion

- Benefiting mental health and focus at school
- Improving air quality at and around schools
- Building community



Participating Schools


West Location

- Single school:
 - Hillside
- 3 weeks: May 9- May 27
- AM and PM road closure (35 mins and 50 mins, respectively)

East Location

- Shared site with 2 schools:
 - Brian W Fleming and St Alfred
- 3 weeks: May 16 June
 3
- PM road closure only (70 minutes)

School Streets Quick Facts

- Has this been tried elsewhere?
 - Yes!
- Won't it just push traffic elsewhere?
 - Past pilots have shown "no"
- Why are we doing this as a pilot?
 - To see whether it impacts how students travel to/from school
 - To see whether it is acceptable
- Are there plans to extend beyond the 3 weeks?
 - Not right now; testing it out first

Three schools in the city will be taking part in a School Streets pilot project, which will create safe and community-friendly spaces for residents to get to school.

A School Street creates a temporary car-free environment in front of a school during drop-off and pick-up times. This creates safe, community-friendly spaces for people walking and cycling to school, including students, their caregivers and teachers.

Volunteer Requirements

- All volunteers must complete required reading and forms before their first shift, including:
 - √ Terms and Conditions Form
 - ✓ COVID Waiver Form
 - ✓ Record of Offenses Declaration Form
 - √ Consent to Audio and Video Form
- All volunteers will be expected to attend a virtual training session, and will be provided with an event t-shirt. They will join one of two teams to help run the School Street at that location.
