


The PM closure will run from 2:30pm to 3:40pm. It will run every day for 3 weeks except Monday May 23 (Victoria Day holiday).

✓ Answer: C Students are contributing to promotion, planning, assisting and leading activities, and helping with evaluation

Students will be playing a huge part in our School Street, including students from local high schools. However, they will not be doing any enforcement of the barriers or escorting vehicles. Funding for the project is provided by the City, via a grant as well as through a donation from Traffic Safety Council, so students do not need to fundraise.





- ? Question: How will residents access their driveways and/or leave during the School Street?

✓ Answer: A Residents must display a pass on their dashboard showing that that may access the street during the closure, and will be escorted in/out.

Dashboard passes will be distributed to residents as part of a Resident Information Package in advance of the pilot. Anyone driving through the street will need to do so with a chaperone, at walking speed.







Purpose of Meeting

- Share with the broader community what we have been planning, and answer questions they may have
- Demonstrate that this project is a collaboration with the community



What we learned from the April 12 meeting at Hillside

- Residents and parents want to know specifically how this will work for them
 - City plans
 - School plans
- Important for residents and parents to hear positive things about the project from local community champions



What we can do

- City to present clear plans of how the road closure will work for residents; schools to present clear plans of how the pick-up will work for parents/caregivers (for bussed/not bussed students)
- We can all share positive things we are contributing to this project (e.g. healthy snacks for students, sensory path for the community, street party on final day)
- Students can create fun videos to play at the beginning of the meeting, to grab the audience attention early on




How to Register as a Volunteer





Calling for Volunteers!



- Activity Leader: Activity leaders will contribute to planning and implementation of activities within the School Street
- Event Supporter: Event supporters will fulfill a variety of roles to help the event run smoothly



Volunteer Requirements

- Volunteers must be fully vaccinated or apply for and receive confirmation of a creed or medical exemption from the City, as per the City of Mississauga's Employee and Volunteer COVID-19 Vaccination Policy
- Volunteers will be required to follow all City and site-specific COVID-19 related protocols
- All volunteers must complete required reading and forms before their first shift, including:
 - ✓ Terms and Conditions Form
 - ✓ COVID Waiver Form
 - ✓ Record of Offenses Declaration Form
 - ✓ Consent to Audio and Video Form
- All volunteers will be expected to attend a virtual training session, and will be provided with an event t-shirt.
