Meadowvale Village Heritage Conservation District (MVHCD) Subcommittee of HAC **Special Requirements**	9	Usual meetings: Meet as required on Tuesdays/ Monthly/ 3:00PM/ Civic Centre MVHCD Subcommittee provides comments and recommendations on heritage permit applications based on the objectives, policies and guidelines set out in the Heritage Conservation District Plan to the Heritage Advisory Committee. **Special Requirements – must be a resident of Meadowvale Village Heritage Conservation District

Quasi-judicial Committees are appointed by Council to make decisions on matters related to City by-laws or local improvements or election campaign finances.

Committee of Adjustment (COA)	7	Usual meetings: Thursday/ Weekly/ 1:00PM and Occasionally 3:00PM/ Council Chamber/Civic Centre
		COA is authorized by the <i>Planning Act</i> to make decisions on applications for minor variances to the City's Zoning By-law, alterations to legal non-conforming land uses and severances of land. Meetings run an average of 2 to 3 hours in length. Members are also required to participate with on-site inspections prior to consideration of an application - additional time commitment of approximately a half day per week.
Committee of Revision (COR)	3 (Members from the Property Standards Committee)	Meets when required to hear appeals related to proposed local improvement charges for cost sharing municipal works under Ontario Regulation 586/06 of the Municipal Act, 2001 titled Local Improvement Charges - Priority Lien Status. The membership of this committee comprises three (3) Members of the Property Standards Committee (PSC).
Incidents in City Facilities Committee (ICFC)	5 (All Members from Mississauga Appeal Tribunal)	Meets as required to hear appeals of Notices of Trespass related to incidents in City-owned facilities. <i>The Membership of this committee comprises all Members of the Appeal Tribunal.</i>
Mississauga	5	Hearing Dates Set Aside on the 4th Tuesday of the Month/ Hearing Room /Civic Centre
Appeal Tribunal (MAT)		MAT hears appeals about decisions made under the City's Licensing By-laws and the Animal Care and Control By-law. Decisions made by the tribunal are final and legally binding. Details on how appeals operate, processed and heard are available in its Rules of Practice and Procedure.
Property Standards	5	Dates Set Aside on the 3 rd Monday of the Month/ Hearing Room /Civic Centre
Committee (PSC)		PSC hears appeals by registered property owners who have received a Property Standards Order regarding a part of their property that does not conform to the Property Standards By-law. Authorized by the <i>Building Code Act</i> and the hearings are operated according to its Rules of Practice and Procedure.

The committee will discuss issues relating to the ongoing operation of Toronto Pearson International Airport and the activities of the GTAA. The CC will be an advisory body for the GTAA President & Chief Executive Officer. The committee will include a broad group of airport, community and government partners and allow for the GTAA to hear concerns expressed in a public forum and to take action as agreed and considered appropriate.
Mississauga Arts Council	1	Usual meetings: 2 nd Tuesday/ Monthly/ Late Afternoon or Early Evening/ Various Locations The Mississauga Arts Council, established in 1981, is a non-profit registered charity governed by a Board of Directors. Their mission is to foster and develop, support and champion a vibrant, dynamic arts community in Mississauga through services and grants, to enrich the lives of its citizens.
Mississauga Public Library Board	3-7	Usual meetings: 3 rd Wednesday/ Monthly/ 5:30PM/ Mississauga Central Library The Board discusses and sets library related policies, advocates to the province and contributes to the library budget before it is tabled by Council. The <i>Public Libraries Act</i> is taken into account through their meeting outcomes. Specifically responsible for providing strategic policy direction for the library system, holding regular meetings, and submitting budgetary estimates to council for approval.
