MINIMUM REQUIREMENTS FOR ENCROACHMENT SKETCHES

The sketch must include the following minimum information:

- 1. Must be prepared by an Engineer, Architect or Surveyor and cannot be an aerial photograph (hand renderings are not acceptable)
- 2. The title of the sketch is to read "Schedule to Encroachment Agreement between the City of Mississauga and (*insert name of the registered owner*)"
- 3. Property lines must be shown and labeled
- 4. Division line between the City property and Applicant's property must be clearly identified in bold
- 5. An arrow or North direction indicator must be shown
- 6. A Legend along one side of the sketch must be included to identify the following details:
 - The municipal address
 - Legal description of the property
 - The total encroachment area (square meters/square feet)
 - Property identification Number (PIN) from the Land Registry Office for the applicant's and the City's property
 - A scale
- 7. Encroachment area to be cross-hatched, including dimensions and labeled
- 8. The item that is encroaching must be included on the sketch and clearly identified, including but not limited to:
 - All city trees
 - Signage
 - Fencing
 - Retaining/ornamental walls
 - Sprinkler systems
 - Decorative lighting
 - Stairs
 - Walkways
 - Ramps for physically challenged
 - Ornamental (statues, planters, etc.)
 - Public art
 - Air conditioning units
 - Pool decking
 - Sheds
 - Walkways
 - Snow-melting and deicing system
 - Landscaping (ie: vegetation gardens, shrubs, hedges, etc.)
