We formally recognize the Anishinaabe origins of our name and continue to make Mississauga a safe space for all Indigenous peoples.





Facility Background

- Originally built in 1981, with a major pool expansion in 1985
- The library addition completed in 1999
- Community centre amenities serve surrounding Ward 8 and Mississauga residents




Current amenities

- Library
- Leisure pool and hot tub
- Auditorium/gymnasium
- Multi purpose spaces
- Equipment-based fitness centre with saunas
- Fitness studio and squash courts
- · Skate park and splash pad
- Shade structure, green spaces and path connections
- Tennis courts

- The facility has served the community well for over 40 years. Numerous building components have now reached end of life and require renewal
- Requires millions of dollars of upgrades to improve operational, functional, and accessibility deficiencies
- Community has been asking for a new and improved centre for many years
- In accordance with the City of Mississauaga's Strategic Plan, this will provide improved infrastructure to citizens for generations, following the City's design principles



In 2019, the City's Future Directions

Master Plans (Recreation, Library, Parks &
Forestry) were approved by Mississauga

Council

- Extensive public surveys about the types of programs and services residents want
- Various stakeholder focus groups
- Members of council and key opinion leader interviews
- Staff surveys and workshops

In 2021, the Province announced it would invest over \$45M to support this project





Priority Project

Both Recreation and Library Future Directions identified South Common CC&L redevelopment as a priority project, with specific recommendations to improve the library, aquatics centre and equipment based fitness centre, enlarge the auditorium to a full size gymnasium, and include a walking track

2022 Survey

Ran for 4 weeks from Mar. 21st to Apr. 18th, 2022 online to help confirm program

18,519 postcards mailed out to all Ward 8 addresses, as well as eblasts, social media, and other campaigns to engage community

1,436 online surveys completed

Survey participants were asked to:

- Provide feedback on preferred recreational programs, services, activities and amenities
- Provide feedback on preferred library programs, spaces and services
- Provide feedback on outdoor amenities surrounding the centre
- Provide feedback on the overall design of the future facility

Key Themes from Survey - Order of Importance

Recreation

- Improve fitness centre, layout, lighting, windows
- Improve lap pool (proper rectangular shape, size, deeper, more lanes)
- Improved change rooms, showers, water temps
- Update/improve overall look/feel/layout/rundown facility
- Add Therapeutic/warm water pool
- Add/improve indoor pickleball courts in gym/times/availability
- Improve lighting/more natural light/windows
- Enlarge gymnasium/improve lighting
- Programming added/improved for- Older Adults/Seniors
- Improve/expanded fitness programming
- Improve fitness/aerobics studio, larger, lighting

Library

- Additional programs for all ages
- Larger collections
- Improved, larger children's area
- More study space for individuals and groups
- More comfortable seating
- Add makerspace and more technology



Parks

- Improve/add tennis courts, make public, winterize
- Improve splash pad/add seating/more shade
- Add winter amenities/rink
- Add pickleball courts
- Add basketball courts

Project Objectives

- Modernize and increase the size of the
 Library to address the community need
- Improve the quality of Recreational services provided to residents
- Create a parkland link to South Common
 Park, and optimize views to the woodlot







 Improve accessibility to meet the City's accessibility goals, comply with AODA and the City's Facility Accessibility Design Standards.

 Design with an environmentally responsible approach, improve energy efficiency and meet the City's Green Building Standards.

 Address aging state of municipal infrastructure

Project Objectives

Key Program Enhancements:

- Library with Makerspace, and Reading Garden
- Indoor aquatic centre with a 6-lane lap pool and therapeutic warm water pool
- Modernized and expanded equipmentbased fitness centre, in addition to a fitness studio, and squash courts
- Full-size gymnasium with an integrated indoor walking track
- Accessible **Multi-purpose** meeting rooms
- Spray Pad and Covered Picnic Area situated in an open Parkland

Other Changes to Program:

 The skateboard park is not included in the program and an alternate site will be identified for relocation



Redevelopment Scope of Work Includes:

- Demolition of existing approx.
 70,000 sq. ft. Community Centre & Library Building
- Construction of a new approx.
 95,000 sq. ft Community Centre & Library Building
- Construction of a new Park, and outdoor site amenities


In 2022, Perkins & Will Architects and Aquicon Construction were selected as the Prime Design Consultant and Construction Management Services through a competitive procurement process.






