TYPES OF BICYCLE LOCKS





CHAIN LOCK

can use anywhereheavy, but moresecure than cable lock



Short period of time High traffic / low risk areas Long period of time Low traffic / high risk areas


WHERE TO LOCK

- In a well lit area with high foot traffic (this is a LOW RISK area)
- To a solid object that is firmly stuck in the ground and cannot be cut
- To an object that the bike cannot be lifted over

HOW TO LOCK







- Make sure the lock is around the most expensive part of your bike (lock your frame first, then wheels)
- Get a **tight fit** less room between the lock and bike will make it more difficult to cut
- Position your lock off the ground with the keyhole facing down
- Use two locks (e.g. cable and U-lock) to make sure your bike is extra secure
- Remember to **remove or secure any loose items** (e.g. helmet, water bottle)

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
