

Land Acknowledgment



 - We want to encourage more of this!




Introducing: School Streets



- Why School Streets?
 - Improves road safety
 - Creates opportunities for kids to be active
 - Benefits mental health and focus at school
 - Improves air quality at and around schools
 - Builds community

School Streets Quick Facts

- Has this been tried elsewhere?
 - Yes!
- Won't it just push traffic elsewhere?
 - Past pilots have shown "no"
- Where do school buses go?
 - Continue to come to school
- Why Corliss?
 - 96% of students within walking distance of school
 - Local road



Effective tool for **increasing awareness** of active school travel as an option



Supported by a majority of school community members surveyed after the pilot





Effective at increasing active travel for school trips





Effective at **decreasing driving** for school trips
