**Re: School Streets Pilot Project**



Dear Resident,

The City of Mississauga, in collaboration with Sts. Peter and Paul Catholic Elementary School, is leading an innovative pilot project in your neighbourhood called **School Streets**. A School Street creates a **temporary, car-free environment** in front of a school during drop-off and/or pick-up times. This creates safe, community-friendly spaces for students and their parents or guardians walking and cycling to and from school. It also limits non-local traffic using the residential street.


Residents living within the closure will be allowed access by vehicle between their driveways and the boundaries of the closure area, if needed. They will be expected to travel at a very slow speed and be aware of children and other pedestrians who may be on the road.

### About the project

The project will launch on May 4 2026 and will run throughout the month of May. In May, the road will be temporarily closed to motor vehicles from approximately **2:45pm-3:45pm on school days only**. (Note: These are approximate times; you will be notified of the exact times closer to the launch of the project.)

**During the afternoon closures in May 2026, Woodington Drive between Bishopstoke Lane and Clevedon Drive will be closed to all vehicle traffic**, with exceptions for school buses, emergency vehicles and residents who live on Woodington Drive within the closure area.

The planned area for the temporary daily road closure on Woodington Drive is shown to the right.



## Getting involved in the project

The City's goal is for this project to be a partnership between the City of Mississauga and your local community. We are working to build a Local Project Planning Team, including representatives from Sts. Peter and Paul School, local residents and other community partners. The Project Planning team will meet up to three times between March and the launch of the pilot in May.

**The first meeting of the Local Project Planning Team is scheduled for Tuesday March 24<sup>th</sup> 2026 at 4:00pm.** For location details and to express your interest in participating, please contact the Project Lead directly for more information (contact information below).

As a resident living in close proximity to the road closure area, you will be provided with more information leading up to the launch of the pilot in May. We welcome any questions and feedback you may have about the project, to help us improve the project and maximize benefits for your community.
