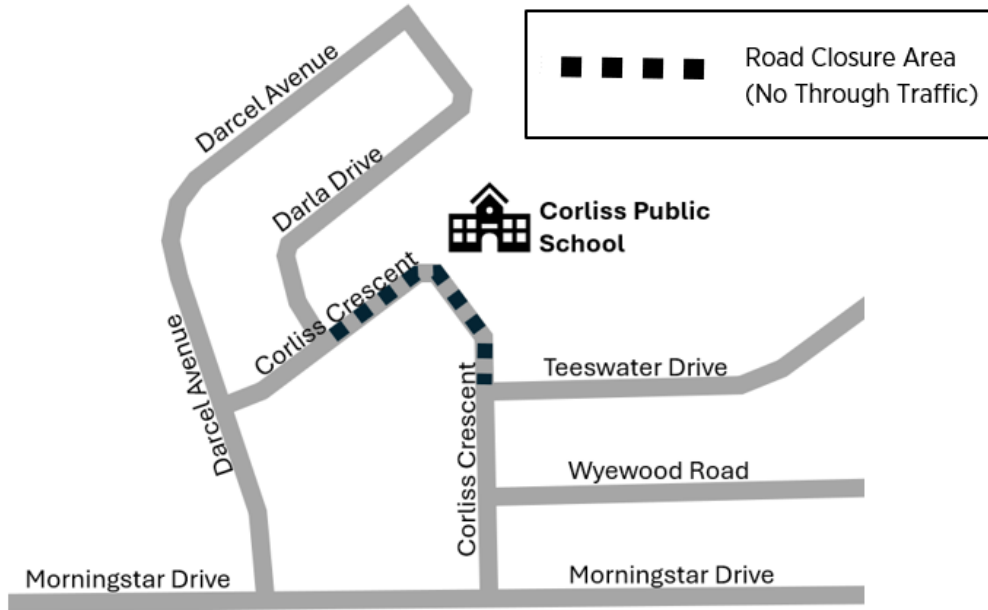


- School Streets are a great way to promote a healthy, happy journey to school!

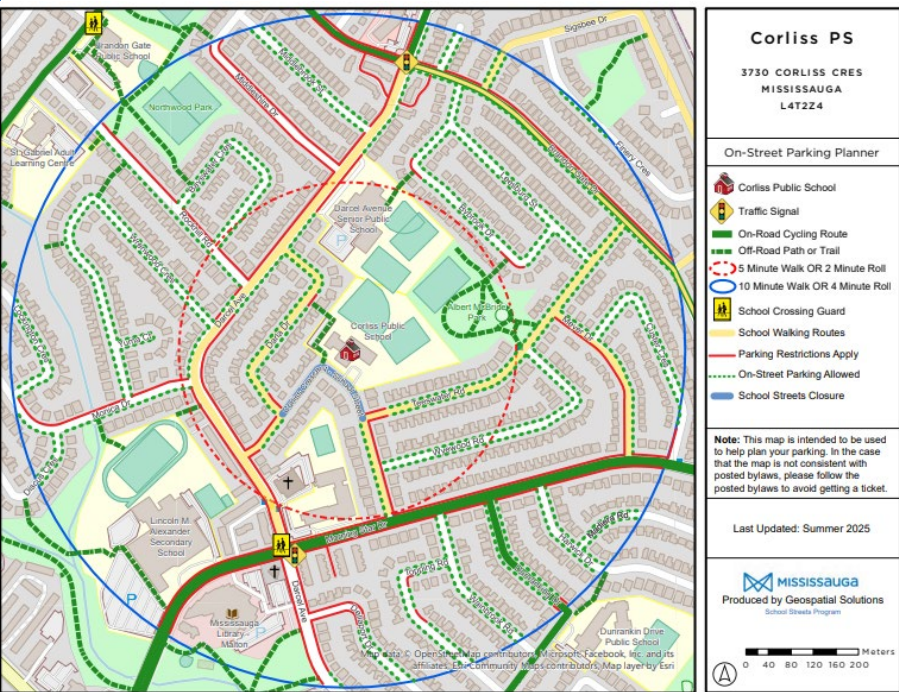
Answer: E
