

PEEL GEARS UP FOR VACCINATING CHILDREN OVER 5

PEEL PUBLIC HEALTH RAMPING UP CLINICS TO ACCOMMODATE 200,000 SHOTS A MONTH WITH YOUTH ELIGIBILITY

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The Region of Peel is anticipating the approval of the

Pfizer COVID-19 vaccine for children aged five to 11 and is planning to vaccinate up to 200,000 people a month when the announcement comes.

"Vaccination remains our surest and fastest way to protect our community and exit the acute phase of the pandemic," said Dr. Lawrence Loh, Peel's medical officer of health.

The region is working to meet the Ontario government's goal of having 90 per cent of the population vac-

nated with two doses and is giving out booster doses to those with compromised immune systems.

Vaccination clinics are once again increasing capacity, and shots will also be delivered on Peel's "vax vans," at community pop-up locations, pharmacies, doctors' offices and at home for

those with mobility challenges.

Between Sept. 20 and Oct. 4, Peel Public Health delivered 20,000 doses of the vaccine into arms across the community.

The results of the Pfizer youth trials have been submitted to Health Canada, which is expected to make

an announcement on the results soon.

Personal Information: Individuals should be aware that any personal information in their verbal or written communication will become part of the public record, unless the individual expressly requests the City to remove the personal information. Information about Appeals: If a person or public body does not make oral submissions at a public meeting or make written submissions to the City before the by-law is passed, the person or public body is not entitled to appeal the decision of City Council to the Local Planning Appeal Tribunal, or be added as a party to an appeal of the decision to the Tribunal. The proposed Official Plan amendment is exempt from approval by the Region of Peel. The decision of City Council is final if a notice of appeal is not received on or before the last day for filing a notice of appeal.
