It helps seniors in Ontario pay for housing, food and other costs of living. The government has expanded the Ontario Guaranteed Annual Income system program and indexed the benefit to inflation. This means you may receive a higher payment or begin receiving a GAINS payment for the first time beginning July 2024.
