Re: Corliss Family Play Day and Road Closure




Dear Resident,

On **Friday June 20**th (rain date: Monday June 23rd) Corliss Public School will be hosting its annual Family Play Day for students and families attending the school. This year, the City of Mississauga will be partnering for the event to run a **School Street** on Corliss Crescent from 8:00am-3:30pm.

A **School Street** creates a **temporary**, **car-free environment** in front of a school. This creates safe, community-friendly spaces for students and their parents or guardians walking and cycling to and from school. It also limits non-local traffic using the residential street.

Residents living within the closure will be allowed access by vehicle between their driveways and the boundaries of the closure area, if needed. They will be expected to travel at a very slow speed and be aware of children and other pedestrians who may be on the road.

The planned area for the road closure on Corliss Crescent is shown below:



About the School Streets project

The event on June 20th (rain date: June 23rd) will serve as a "soft launch" for the project which will launch in September 2025 and will run through June 2026. In these months, the road will be temporarily closed to motor vehicles **Monday-Friday** from **8:15am-9:00am daily and** from **2:30pm-3:15pm daily.**

During the daily closures, Corliss Crescent between Darla Drive and Teeswater Road will be closed to all vehicle traffic, with exceptions for school buses, emergency vehicles and residents who live on Corliss Crescent within the closure area.

Residents are encouraged to plan their vehicle travel outside of the daily closure periods, where possible, toward establishing a car-free environment during the School Street. Where it is not possible to avoid driving during the closure periods, residents will be expected to travel at a very slow speed and be aware of children and other pedestrians who may be on the road for the expanse of the School Street.

Getting involved in the project

The City's goal is for this project to be a partnership between the City of Mississauga and your local community. We have established a Local Project Planning Team, including representatives from Corliss Public School, local residents and other community partners. The Project Planning team will meet up to three times between April and the launch of the pilot in September, then again approximately once every two months or as needed once the project has launched. If you are interested in participating in the Local Project Planning Team, please contact the Project Lead directly for more information (contact information below).

As a resident living in close proximity to the road closure area, you will be provided with more information leading up to the launch of the pilot in September. We welcome any questions and feedback you may have about the project, to help us improve the project and maximize benefits for your community.
