Re: Update to School Streets Pilot Project



Dear Resident,

As of October 22, the School Streets program at Corliss Public School is paused. The City will work with the community to re-evaluate and determine next steps for the program. Further updates will be shared as they become available.

The traffic calming bollards on Corliss Crescent near the school will remain in place until they are removed for the winter season. However, staff will not be putting up barriers, and the road will remain open to vehicles during school drop-off and pickup times until further notice.

Getting involved in the project

The City's goal is for this project to be a partnership between the City of Mississauga and your local community. We have established a Local Project Planning Team, including representatives from Corliss Public School, local residents and other community partners. The Project Planning team met four times between April and October of 2025, and will meet again approximately once every two months or as needed until the end of the 2025-2026 school year.
