- Safety Audit Walk in November

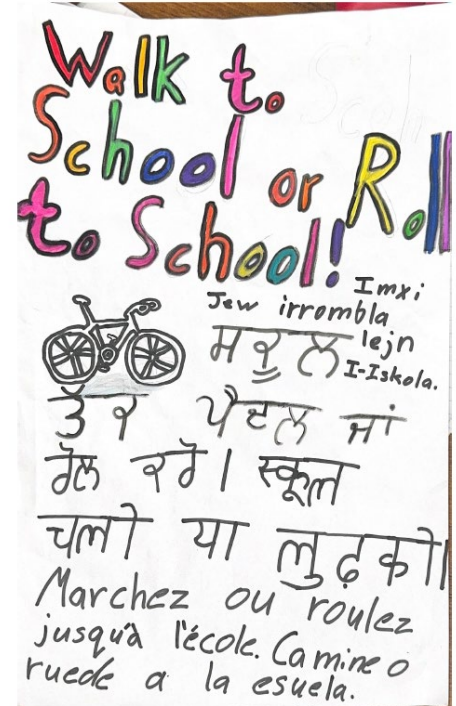
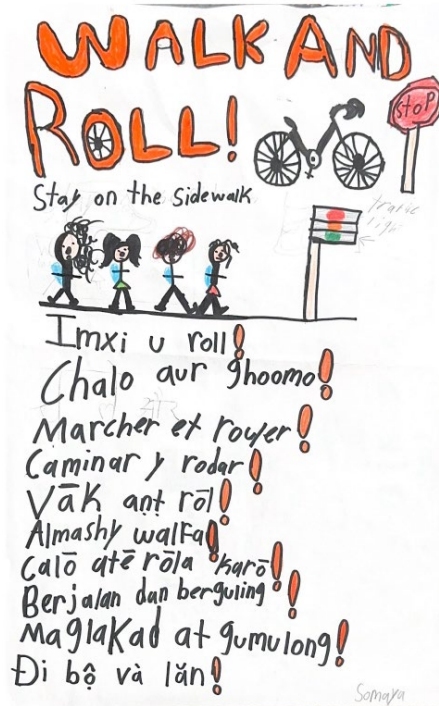


Safety Audit Walk
