This office has reviewed the above-mentioned report, which has been submitted to this ministry as a condition of licensing in accordance with Part VI of the *Ontario Heritage Act*, R.S.O. 1990, c 0.18.<sup>1</sup> This review has been carried out in order to determine whether the licensed professional consultant archaeologist has met the terms and conditions of their licence, that the licensee assessed the property and documented archaeological resources using a process that accords with the 2011 *Standards and Guidelines for Consultant Archaeologists* set by the ministry, and that the archaeological fieldwork and report recommendations are consistent with the conservation, protection and preservation of the cultural heritage of Ontario.

The report documents the Stage 1-2 assessment of the study area as depicted in Map 9 of the above titled report and recommends the following:

#### Stage 1 Recommendations

Therefore, it is recommended that the entire subject property be subjected to a Stage 2 shovel test pit assessment at 5 m intervals, since the area cannot be ploughed. As the property inspection revealed the area has not been in agricultural use for some time as evident by the tall grass, weeds and scrubby trees currently present on the property.

#### Stage 2: Recommendations

Based on the above analysis and conclusion that the subject property no longer has any cultural heritage value or archaeological potential, no further archaeological assessment is recommended for this property.

Based on the information contained in the report, the ministry is satisfied that the fieldwork and reporting for the archaeological assessment are consistent with the ministry's 2011 *Standards and Guidelines for Consultant Archaeologists* and the terms and conditions for archaeological licences. This report has been entered into the Ontario Public Register of Archaeological Reports.
