Re: School Streets Pilot Project



Dear Resident,

The City of Mississauga, in collaboration with Sts. Peter and Paul Catholic Elementary School, is leading an innovative pilot project in your neighbourhood called **School Streets**. A School Street creates a **temporary, car-free environment** in front of a school during drop-off and/or pick-up times. This creates safe, community-friendly spaces for students and their parents or guardians walking and cycling to and from school. It also limits non-local traffic using the residential street.

Residents living within the closure will be allowed access by vehicle between their driveways and the boundaries of the closure area, if needed. They will be expected to travel at a very slow speed and be aware of children and other pedestrians who may be on the road.

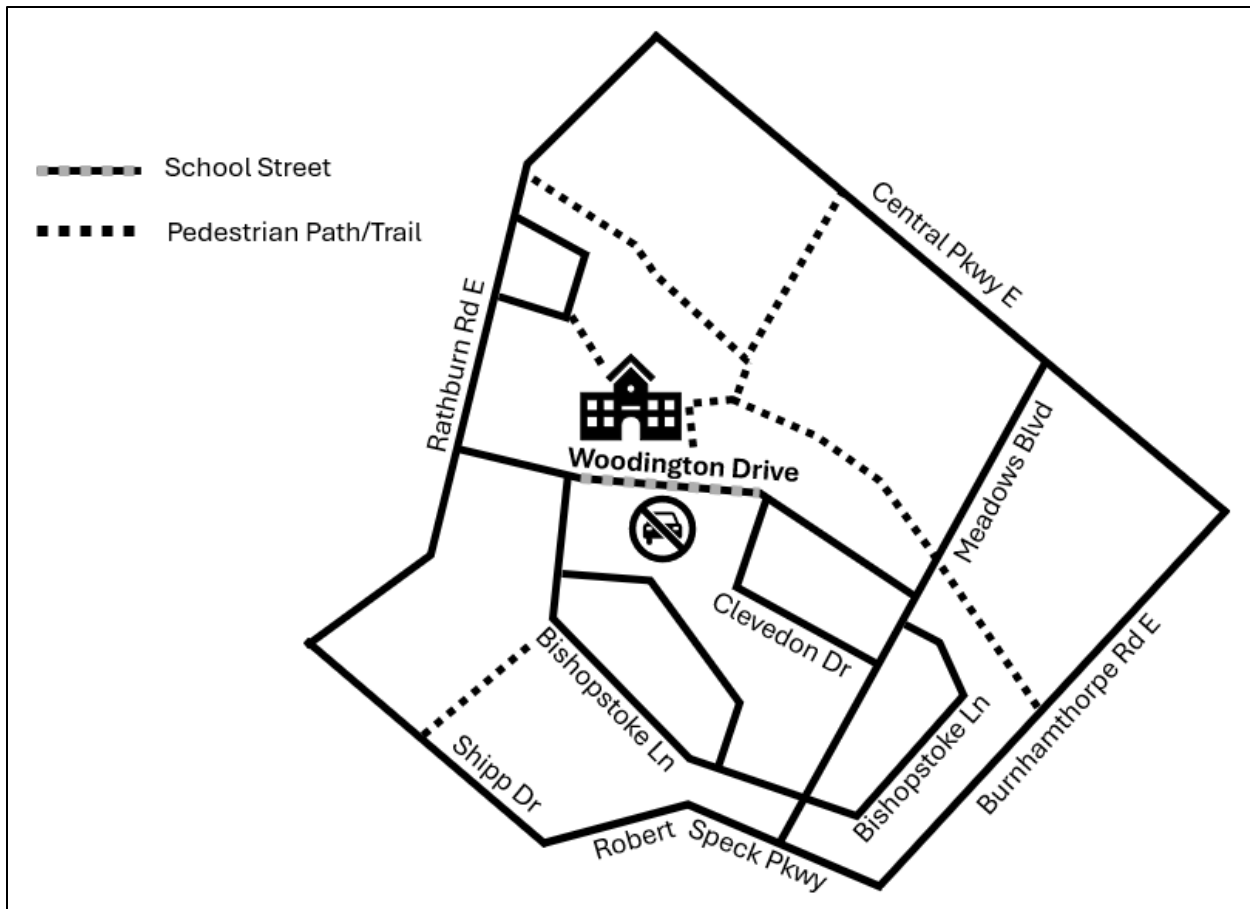
All other residents will be redirected around the closure area, to keep the space as car-free as possible so that the space is open for community members to enjoy.

About the School Street project

The project will launch next Monday May 4 2026 and will run throughout the month of May. In May, the road will be temporarily closed to motor vehicles from **2:45pm-3:45pm on school days only**. The School Street will not operate on school holidays (Friday May 15) or on Victoria Day (Monday May 18).

During the afternoon closures in May 2026, Woodington Drive between Bishopstoke Lane and Clevedon Drive will be closed to all vehicle traffic, with exceptions for school buses, emergency vehicles and residents who live on Woodington Drive within the closure area.
