Grass Caterpillar

Create your own grass caterpillar that can you leave on your windowsill, or put in your garden.

Time to complete: 30 Minutes Age Group: 5+ (with assistance)

Materials:

• Bucket, Scissors, Potting soil, Grass seed, Nylon stockings, Craft googly eyes, Coloured pipe cleaners, Hot-glue gun, glitter glue, pompoms

Instructions:

- 1. In a plastic bucket or tub mix together potting soil and grass seeds. Enough to fill one or a couple of stocking legs depending on how many you want to make.
- 2. Cut the waist band off the stockings, so you have two tube-like sections. Do not cut the toe.
- 3. Fill the stocking leg with soil until it reaches the desired thickness. Tie it off at the end with a knot.
- 4. Using the coloured pipe cleaners, divide the stocking into sections to make the caterpillar's body.
- 5. Soak your caterpillar in a bucket or tub of water for 10 minutes.
- 6. After 10 minutes, take the caterpillar out and using a hot glue gun, glue googly eyes on the front of the nylon (unknotted end). Also use glitter glue to make a mouth and a pompom for a nose.
- 7. Twist two pipe cleaners together to make antennae and either poke them through the nylon, or glue them onto the top of the caterpillar
- 8. Cut 4 pipe-cleaners in half and bend them to make legs. Insert along the caterpillar's body either by poking them through the nylon or using the hot glue.
- 9. Put your caterpillar in the sunshine and watch it grow!! Give him a haircut when it gets too long!
